News from CPC in the Hill — March 2017 Update



CITY FORUM CONFERENCE & EMPOWERING CPC IN THE HILL LEADERS—Our small circle of church leadership has been involved in a New England group of pastors, church planters, and Christian workers that gather each year to discuss what we are all doing to engage our communities with Jesus and meet our community's needs. John, Maxine, Lisa, and I join table-mates from our region in CT (and one person from Zambia) to discuss and plan together how our churches can put to work the things we learn at the City Forum Conference. Maxine asked me: "Why is it good that we go to these?" I replied: "When CPC in The Hill is in the house [at the conference], we are the population they're trying to reach. Of course, we learn good things for ourselves to act on, but we also bring a realness to the table discussion."



This gathering and conference is sponsored by the *Emmanuel Gospel Center, Vision New England, Greater Things for Greater Boston, and the Luis Palau Association.* In joining this gathering, Maxine and John, our two CPC in The Hill leaders, are empowered to be agents of Jesus—they add to the discussion and begin to think, "Now what can we do in the Hill?" It is my

hope to be able to get our CPC in The Hill leaders to attend other empowering workshops and conferences.

NEW SUNDAY BRUNCH—Our landlord at 158 Davenport Ave made some major changes in the building. Although we were able to move our Sunday worship

service to 10:00am, we lost our big fellowship room downstairs. We missed our monthly fellowship meals for a few months. And, we are a food-fellowship bunch! So, we tried a "Brunch" in February in the small meeting room upstairs. There was plenty of food. The cozy fellowship was good. We are learning how to adapt—and we are confident we will run out of room and must refigure out how to do our monthly fellowship meal—again!



MISSION SUNDAY & THE CHILDREN'S MESSAGE—We always seem to have a

nice group of kids—some who even tell their parents they want to go to church—on Saturday! As you might already know each Sunday service I give a children's message—a priceless moment. We've decided to take one Sunday each month and highlight missions—maybe a country, a group of people, a missionary, or a missionary story. Our pilot story was about America's first missionary, George Liele, a former slave who sold himself back into servitude, so he could go to Jamaica to plant a church. We want our kids to catch the vision of Revelation 5, where those purchased by the blood of the Lamb from every tribe and language and people and nation have gathered around the throne to worship the King of kings.

Update on Financial Goals—We are thankful for those who have given or pledged, so far, \$13,839 to this year's budget (9/1/16–9/31/17) that is \$98,456. Along with our anchor church support for this year (\$60,000), this puts us at 36% of our responsibility. We still need to raise \$24,617 to cover ministry expenses here in the Hill. We are looking for a few more churches to join us by supporting our church plant and ministry in The Hill. Help us get to the 100%. See below for how best to donate to our CPC in The Hill account.

Update on Prayer Partner Goals—We now have 189 prayer partners and continue to seek 200 to join us. I am confident, however, that we have over 200, since a few churches are praying for us as well as those wonderful ladies at the Bible study in Rome, NY.
