OUR FIRST PRE-CAMP TRAINING & COMMUNITY WORSHIP SERVICE—Our CPC 2019 Impact Week started with our first annual Pre-Camp Training and Community Worship in the Hill here on Davenport Ave. Our own Rick Varrone and his son's family's band provided some worship. The evening revolved around the theme, "What Does Mercy Look Like in the Hill?" Pastor Craig, from our anchor church, kicked off the teaching time with an exposition of Ephesians 4.

Afterward I had two teaching sessions: 1) Matthew 9:13, "Go

and learn what this means: 'I desire *mercy*, and not sacrifice'" and the issue of clean vs. unclean; and, 2) The Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:37), "He said, 'The one who showed him *mercy*.' And Jesus said to him, 'You go, and do likewise'" and the concept of "strong and weak ties." We concluded with a brief training for volunteers—how to express mercy to our Sports & Arts campers. Over 45 adults and teenagers attended. It was an incredible evening. We intend to build on this with next year's Impact Week with our 2nd annual Pre-Camp Worship, Bible Teaching, and Training.





2019 HILL SPORTS & ARTS CAMP—This year we saw many new families; this is a good thing, hoping to make broader and wider connections here in the Hill. The devotional time covered the acronym G.R.A.C.E: *God's Riches At Christ's Expense*.

The kids enjoyed five days of soccer, some did basketball, and some Art. The kids in the Arts class made a quilt and pillows. The quilt they made will be given to the Executive Director of the local non-profit, Christian Community Action, to give to a client who could use a blanket and be encouraged. We had an average of 50 kids and 30 teen volunteers over the five



days of last week of June. On the Saturday after camp we had a wonderful post-camp BBQ at Maxine's on Stevens Street, where 100+ from CPC in The Hill, CPC New Haven (our anchor church), camper families, and many community members enjoyed food and fellowship.



THE 2019 PARK BBQ MINISTRY KICKED OFF THE 1ST WEDNESDAY IN JULY—The 2019 Summer BBQ Park ministry, "In His Midst," began its first of eight Wednesday evenings on July 3rd. Even with some rain (we have a no cancelation policy) 60+ showed up for

the first park sermon and grilled hot dogs and hamburgers, salad, a number of other dishes, and dessert. We noted many new families, children, and teens this year. So, we needed, again, to gain their trust. Many returned for the following

Update on our Financial Resources—We are grateful for all who gave out of their abundance to put us at 91% of our fundraising goal for this year (FY19). We still have a few (in that 91%) to catch up or give toward what we expected in FY19, but still over all, it was our best fundraising year since I started 3 years ago.
